June 6th 1944: D-Day, the largest amphibious landing in history, began in the early-morning hours as Allied forces landed in Normandy on the northern coast of France. Operation Overlord took months of planning and involved 1,527,000 soldiers in 47 Allied divisions along with 4,400 ships and landing craft, and 11,000 aircraft.

WHITE MOUNTAIN VETERAN TRIBUTE CHILI COOK-OFF RULES AND APPLICATION SEPTEMBER 17, 2022

Rules A maximum of 4 cooks and 2 servers per team may contribute/participate.

- A detailed recipe must accompany your application and list all ingredients, including spices. You may serve crackers or cornbread if you wish. We suggest small serving plates be furnished for easier handling to your guest.
- 2. Due to food-allergy concerns, a list of your ingredients will be posted at the event!
- 3. Ingredients will be inspected at noon and cooking will commence.
- 4. You must prepare 5 gallons of chili and begin serving at 5 PM.
- 5. All food must be cooked on site. BBQ grills, cooking appliances are to be supplied by your team. A limited number of electrical outlets are available.
- 6. Tasting cups and spoons will be furnished. Cooking appliances, grills, utensils, napkins, and small plates are to be supplied by your team.
- 7. The health department requires gloves, aprons, hats, water, and clean-up washbasins to be furnished by the team.
- 8. This is a bazaar type event so a food handler's card is not required..
