### This month in American history:

Every month we like to share the anniversaries of our military, here are just a few...



October 2, 1799: Establishment of Washington Navy Yard.

The Washington Navy Yard is the U.S. Navy's oldest shore establishment, in operation since the first decade of the 19th century. It evolved from a shipbuilding center to an ordnance plant and then to the ceremonial and administrative center for the Navy. The yard is home to the Chief of Naval Operations and is headquarters for the Naval Historical Center, the Marine Corps Historical Center, and numerous naval commands.



October 16, 1872:

Apache (Chiricahua) leader Cochise signed a peace treaty with General O.O. Howard in Arizona Territory.



October 29, 1952:

Eight Navy Aircraft from VF-54 struck the city of Kapsan in North Korea. Intelligence reports had indicated that a congregation of high-level Communist Party officials would be attending a meeting there. A week following the raid, North Korean broadcasts denounced the strike and labeled the participants as the "Butchers of Kapsan."



October 31, 1971:

Saigon began the release of 1,938 Hanoi POW's.

The United States listed about 2,500 Americans as prisoners of war or missing in action but only 1,200 Americans were reported to have been killed in action with no body recovered. Many of these were airmen who were shot down over North Vietnam or Laos.
